Founding President, Section VIII, Couples and Family Therapy, and founding co-chair, Committee on Psychoanalysis and Health, and the Committee on Psychoanalysis and Community, Division 39, APA. Author, *The Embedded Self: An Integrative Psychodynamic and Systemic Perspective on Couple and Family Therapy*, and author of numerous journal articles, book chapters, and other publications on the integration of psychoanalytic, family systemic and attachment theory, and on chronic illness, adult development and psychoanalytic activism.

BEVERLY GREENE, PhD, ABPP

Professor of Psychology, St. John's University. Fellow, APA and eight of its divisions; Fellow, Academy of Clinical Psychology. Author of over 100 publications in the psychological literature, some of which received national awards of distinction. Recipient of numerous national awards for distinguished contributions to the greater understanding of the intersections of race, gender, sexual orientation and multiple identity paradigms. Her work has advocated for the greater integration of psychological research, practice and social justice. Co-Editor, with Koocher and Norcross, *The Psychologists' Desk Reference*; Co-Editor, with Brodbar, *A Minyan of Women: Family Dynamics, Jewish Identity and Psychotherapy Practice*; Co-Editor, with Comas-Diaz, *Psychological Health of Women of Color: Intersections, Challenges and Opportunities*. She is a practicing clinical psychologist in New York City.

JADE MCGLEUGHLIN, LICSW

Assistant Editor, *Psychoanalytic Dialogues* and Contributing Editor, *Studies in Gender and Sexuality*.
